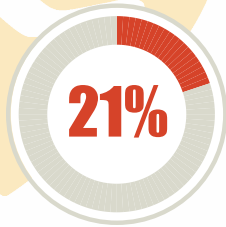
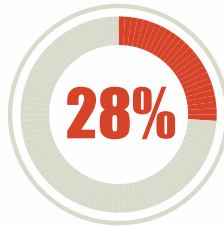

Over 400K Hawai'i Residents Rely on Medicaid/QUEST

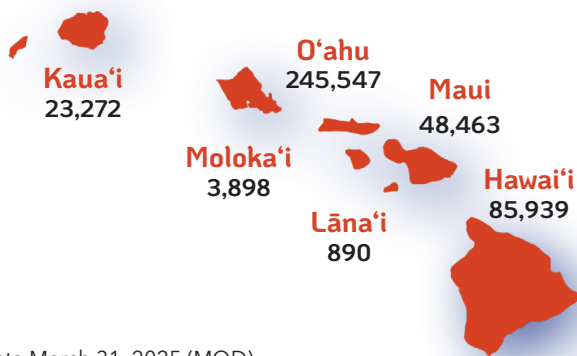


1 in 5 in the U.S. 83 million beneficiaries¹

Populations Covered by Medicaid



Children: 1 in 3 keiki in Hawai'i. Nationally, 39% of children, and 80% of children in households under 100% FPL.¹



Births: 1 in 3 births in Hawai'i are covered by Medicaid.



Working Adults: Nationally, 64% are working and 29% are students, caregivers, disabled or ill.³



Individuals with Disabilities: QUEST covers 2 in 7 working-age adults with disabilities. Nationally, 41% of adults 19-64 with disabilities.¹

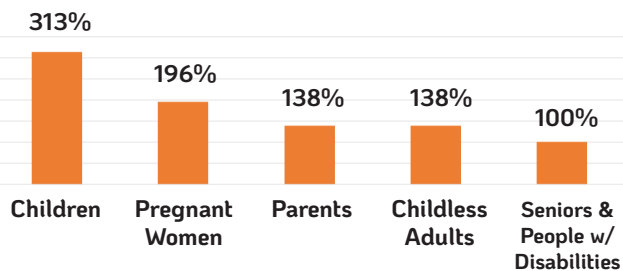


Veterans: As of 2015, nearly 1 in 10 veterans ages 19-64 nationally and over 4,200 in Hawai'i.⁴



Behavioral Health Access: Nationally, nearly 40% of Medicaid adults ages 19-64 had a mental health or substance use disorder (SUD) in 2020.⁵

Eligibility (Percent of Federal Poverty Level)



For 2025, 100% of FPL is \$30,660 for a family of three and \$18,000 for an individual



As Medicaid Turns 60 and CHIP turns 25, BOTH PROGRAMS ARE AT RISK.

- This year, Congress is proposing to cut Medicaid and CHIP funding. These programs have a long history of helping millions of Americans. Medicaid was created 60 years ago by Congress in 1965. In 2000, Congress enacted the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP), expanding coverage to more low-income children.
- Medicaid is funded by the state and federal government.
 - Hawai'i received \$2.2 billion in federal support for Medicaid in 2023.⁶
 - Federal Medicaid funding = 73% of the Medicaid spending in Hawai'i.⁶
- Loss of federal funding due to proposed cuts will be very harmful for Hawai'i's residents. Impacts to QUEST may result in reductions to benefits, eligibility, and/or payments to providers.
